- Pass Meetings
  - Title teachers, Lisa Ballinger, Monica Ahrens, Angela Sandretto are working to create a system for Pass
  - o Pass meetings will begin in February
  - o These meetings will address current students who are struggling with academics or behavior
- School Improvement Committee
  - o Representatives from all grade levels, special education, and title
  - o Working to develop a plan for next school year
  - o Group is working hard to develop plans for the next school year
  - o Keeping what is working for the elementary and brainstorming what needs to be changed
- Birth-3 Monitoring
  - o Birth-3 developing a virtual play activity for families
- Teachers continue to work with students
  - o Assessing students' current academic levels and working to build on those skills
  - o Remote learners come to meet with teachers as needed
- Packet pick-up will continue Wednesdays for remote students
  - $\circ$  8:45 am 1:00 pm
  - o 2:30 5:45 pm
- Technology Update
  - o 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade computers have been added in the classroom 1:1
    - Teachers are beginning to teach students how to use the basics of the computers for communication and some academics
  - o K-2 Tablets have been added for use during the academic day
    - Each classroom received 10 tablets

Superintendent Owsley reported that 80 Staff Members have received their first COVID-19 vaccination. 800 people in Macoupin County were vaccinated that day. Compliments extended to MCPH Clinic that no one had to wait in long lines.

Superintendent Owsley reported that CUSD 7 has been receiving equipment from Blackburn for the Cooperative Learning/Sharing Teachers Program funded by a USDA Rural Development grant secured by Blackburn for distance learning. Equipment will be installed beginning March 24<sup>th</sup>.

Superintendent Owsley reported that he meets with Union leadership on Tuesdays and Thursdays to keep plans formed and carried out.

#### **Old Business**

Superintendent Owsley reported that in the Shop Expansion Project, the concrete has been poured. The building is to arrive in February.

Superintendent Owsley gave the IESA/IHSA Update. He sent out information Thursday. However, information was changed on Friday. IHSA announced that having received good news from IDPH, all Regions are now out of Tier 3 mitigations. Having now being placed in Phase 4, our district can now conduct intraconference and intra-region contest in high-risk sports. Moderate-risk sports competing outdoors in Phase 4 also received expanded scheduling opportunities, including tournaments and out-of-state contests. IHSA Board of Directors will set season dates for the remainder of the school year when they meet Wednesday, January 27<sup>th</sup>. As previously directed from IHSA all winter low risk sports must conduct practice on seven days prior to their first contest. Basketball teams must conduct 12 days of practice prior to their first contest. Fall, spring, and summer sports can begin contact days on Monday based on the allowances of EMS Region and local school district approval. Masks must be worn in practice and competition. Social distancing should be adhered to for bench players and game personnel. School must follow the mitigations and guidelines established by the IHSA. IDPH 's guidance for spectators at contest, with no differentiation in the numbers regardless of whether the sport is indoors or outdoors, in Phase 4 Regions, a maximum of 50 spectators; in Tier 1 Regions, a maximum of 25 spectators; in Tier 2 Regions, no spectators.
